Agreat lesson learned

What a blast! Long Beach Better Learning After School Today drew a crowd of more than 200 guests for a wine tasting event Nov. 10.

Students majoring in Communications Studies at CSULB did much of the planning as a hands-on class project. Working with their professor, Kirran Moss, the BLAST Board of Directors and staff, the students raised nearly \$40,000 for the organization.

The seventh annual event, Wine BLAST 2010, was held at the beautiful offices of Keesal, Young & Logan with wines provided by local wine bar, 4 th Street Vine and other vendors. Guests had a chance to sample more than 20 wines from France, Argentina, Italy, and our own great California varietals. Wines were paired with hors d'oeuvres including risotto with grilled asparagus and bacon wrapped beef tenderloin. Scrumptious desserts were served with champagne kirs. Live music was provided by Canela Negra.

The event also included terrific silent and live auctions. Items were diverse, ranging from merchandise and gifts from local shops and restaurants to tickets for the Lakers, Clippers, Kings and Dodgers. Supervisor Don Knabe was his usual entertaining and successful auctioneer. FYI: BLAST was founded ten years ago as a way to improve after-school learning for at-risk children and youth through collaboration. BLAST trains college students from CSULB and LBCC as academic mentors to work one-on-one or in small groups with K-12 students. BLAST also provides literacy tutoring to children in the probation system, helps students pass the high school exit exam and operates its own after school program at a housing development where nearly 90% of the residents live below the poverty line. Since opening its doors ten years ago, BLAST has placed nearly 4,300 mentors who have served almost 6,000 children at more than 40 school and community locations in the greater Long Beach area. BLAST's newest program, "Bridge to College," is providing the most highly at-risk high school students in Long Beach with a pathway from high school graduation to enrollment in a college, trade or technical school.

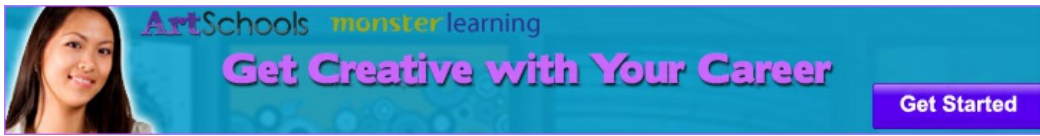
